





Party Identification: A person's ingrained sense of loyalty to a political party.



  - People who respond Democrat or Republican are partisans.





Has partisanship been declining since the 1950s?








#### Democrat and Republican Identifiers over Time

- Population: The group we want to study
  - Voting Age Population (230,872,030 people)
  - Voting Eligible Population (213,313,508 people)
  - Registered voters vs likely voters
- Sample: A subset of the population that we are studying
  - 1000 people out of the VAP or VEP
  - Used to estimate the population
  - Probability sample- a sample in which each individual in the population has a known probability of being chosen at random for inclusion in the sample.
  - What are some potential sampling problems?




## Sampling Error: the degree to which the sample estimates might differ from what the population actually thinks.

## Florida: Obama vs Romney






