# Feminine Style-Campbell (1989)

## Feminine

1. personal tone
2. address the audience as peers
3. invites audience participation or action
4. relies on personal experience, anecdotes and other examples
5. identifies with the experience of the audience
6. is structured inductively

## Masculine

1. use of impersonal or incomplete examples
2. affirmation of personal experiences
3. relies on expert authority
4. deductive logic
